02/20/2021 4:44 pm	100 block Commerce St. Sterling	<b>Shooting (Press Release):</b> A 19-year-old from Sterling has been charged with aggravated malicious wounding and use of a firearm in the commission of a felony following a shooting Saturday afternoon on Commerce Street near E. Holly Avenue.  Antonio Fernandez was taken into custody shortly after the shooting and a firearm was recovered. The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) responded to the Sterling area shortly after 4:45 p.m. on February 20 for an adult male suffering a gunshot wound. LCSO Deputies quickly established a perimeter and a suspect in the incident was identified. The victim was taken to a local hospital where he is listed in stable condition.  Fernandez is being held at the Loudoun County Adult Detention Center on no bond. The suspect and the victim are known to each other and there was no threat to the community. The circumstances surrounding the shooting remain under investigation. SO2100002851

02/18/2021	Leesburg	<b>Marketplace Scam:</b> The complainant reported that she listed an item for sale and was contacted by a person who advised that they would pay additional money to have the phone overnighted. The complainant sent the item and received an email from <a href="mailto:servicepaypalunit01@gmail.com">servicepaypalunit01@gmail.com</a> , instructing her to send confirmation that she paid for the item and to purchase gift cards as proof. Ultimately the complainant was out the cost of the item sent as well as additional monies she spent in gift cards. SO2100002855
02/17/2021	Sterling	<b>Craigslist / eBay Scam:</b> The complainant reported seeing an ad for a vehicle and contacted the seller. The seller advised him the vehicle was being sold through eBay and he would receive an email shortly. The complainant received an email from <a href="mailto:ebay@vehicle-protection-inc.com">ebay@vehicle-protection-inc.com</a> with instructions to purchase gift cards and call a phone number and provide the gift card information, in which he did. This case remains under investigation. SO2100002787

As COVID-19 vaccine distribution begins, here are signs of potential scams:

- You are asked to pay out of pocket to get the vaccine.
- You are asked to pay to put your name on a vaccine waiting list or to get early access.
- Advertisements for vaccines through social media platforms, email, telephone calls, online, or from unsolicited/unknown sources.
- Marketers offering to sell or ship doses of the vaccine for payment.

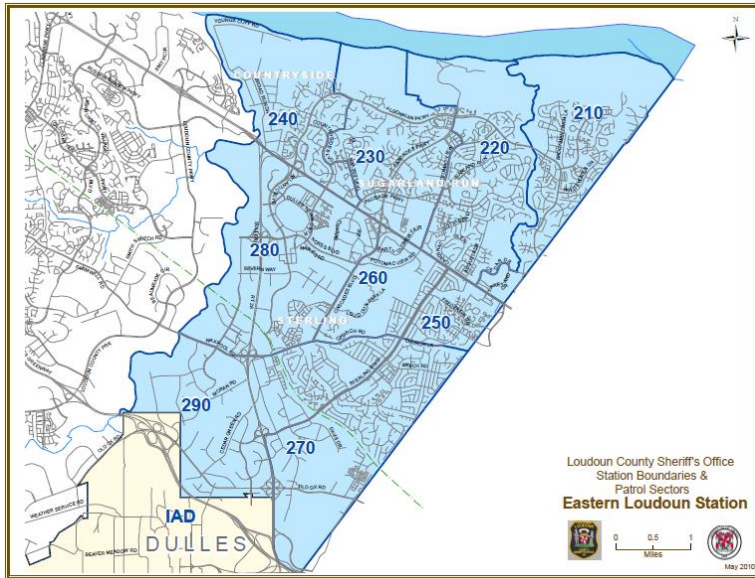

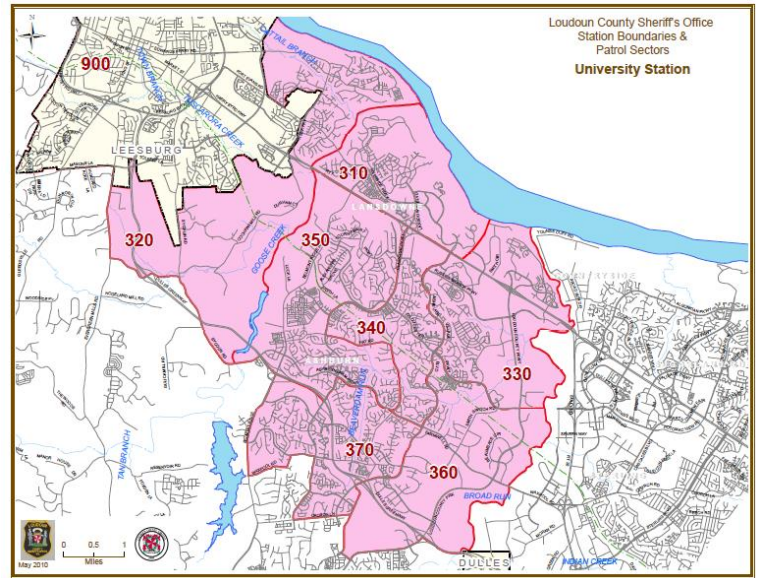

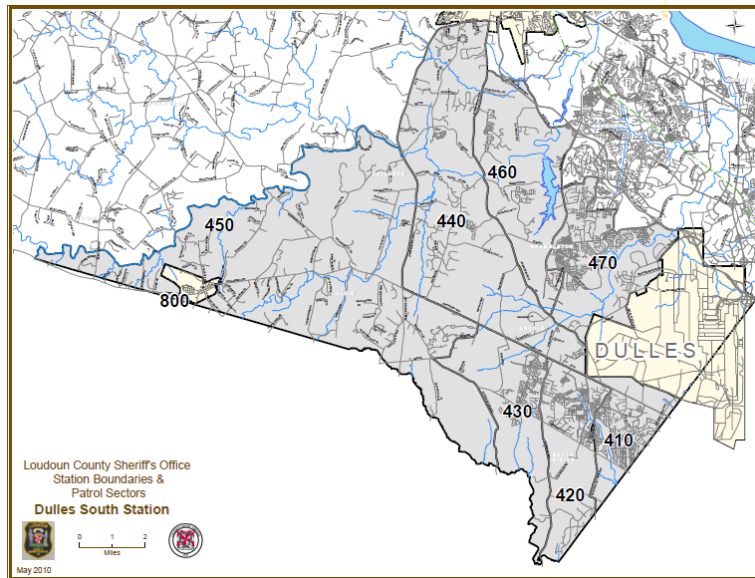
### Eastern Loudoun Station: SECTOR 2
