### BIKE, SCOOTER, & SKATEBOARD SAFETY

#### Bicycles

- Make sure your child wears a proper fitting helmet, bright colored clothing, and reflective gear. Use a white front light and a rear red light at night or when visibility is poor.
- Check the bike to ensure the breaks, lights, reflectors, and tires are working properly.
- Teach children the rules of the road. Bicycles are considered vehicles and must obey the same rules as motorists.

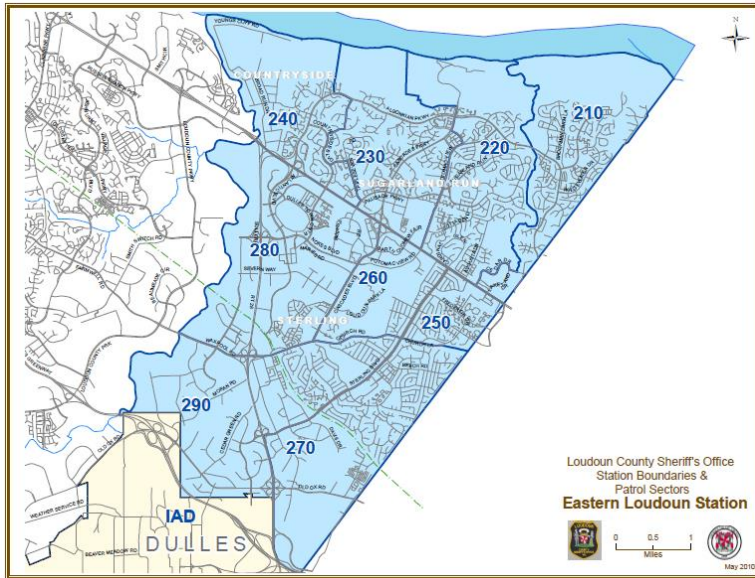

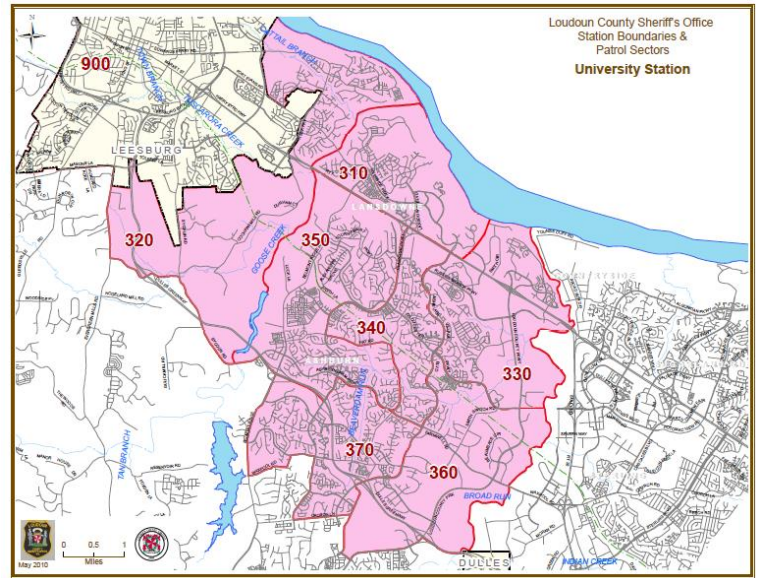

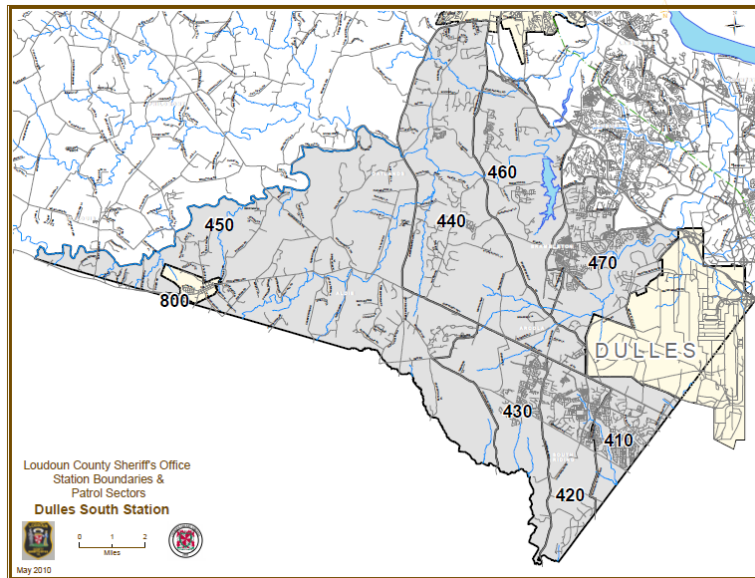
**Eastern Loudoun Station: SECTOR 2**
