**Northstar Boulevard "Pardon Our Dust"
Meeting Wednesday 12/1**

On November 5, the County officially broke ground on the long-awaited project to extend Northstar Boulevard from Tall Cedars Parkway to Route 50. This project will improve capacity and safety on the Dulles South road network while helping reduce congestion on Route 50. Shirley Contracting is building the \$45.8 million project, which currently has an anticipated completion date of winter 2024.

At my request, a "**Pardon Our Dust**" public meeting has been scheduled for **Wednesday, December 1** from **7:00-8:00 p.m. at Arcola Elementary School** (located at 41740 Tall Cedars Parkway in Stone Ridge). We know that projects like this can be disruptive to the surrounding communities, and we want to make the process go as smoothly as it can. At the meeting, residents will have a chance to meet the project team and get details on the stages of construction and ask questions. I hope you can attend. Redistricting Tool Virtual Workshop **Thursday 11/18**

Members of the public are invited to take part in an online workshop to learn how to use the online mapping tool developed for Loudoun County's local redistricting process.

The workshop, scheduled for 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 18, will provide a general overview of Loudoun's redistricting project, an introduction to online resources on local redistricting, and a demonstration of the online redistricting tool. Staff members of the Office of Mapping and Geographic Information will also answer technical questions regarding the online tool.

Through November 30, the public can use the online tool to develop and submit their own redistricting plans for consideration. The tool, which is available on the [Redistricting Hub](#), includes examples of local redistricting plans as well as a blank plan for the public to use as a starting point.

Login information for the November 18 workshop is posted at loudoun.gov/remoteparticipation.

A series of instructional videos, available on the county's YouTube channel, is available for members of the public to learn how to use the tool. Through these videos, individuals can learn how to create their own plans and submit them for consideration by the county. [Watch the videos here](#).

The local redistricting process determines which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a district for purposes of electing members to the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors and School Board. By making sure districts have approximately the same number of people, redistricting can help to ensure residents

COVID-19 Vaccinations

As a reminder, Loudoun County has resumed vaccination operations by appointment only at its Dulles Town Center site, located at 21090 Dulles Town Circle in Sterling. Vaccination remains the best protection against COVID-19 and the Delta variant. The vast majority of newly infected people are unvaccinated and includes individuals in all age groups.

The CDC is now recommending that everyone **ages 5 and older** get a COVID-19 vaccine. Please check with your child's healthcare provider to see if they offer the vaccine. For more information on why children and teens should get vaccinated for COVID-19, please click [here](#).

The Virginia Department of Health has authorized local health districts to administer booster doses of the Pfizer, Johnson & Johnson (J&J), and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines for certain individuals as [recommended](#) by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and [authorized](#) by the Food and Drug Administration. There are now booster recommendations for all three available COVID-19 vaccines in the United States.

In addition, the CDC and VDH have approved a “mix and match” approach to boosters, allowing people to receive a different brand of vaccine for

the booster dose than what they received in their initial vaccine series. For example, someone who received the one dose J&J vaccine could receive either the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine as a booster.

Loudoun County is now offering booster doses of the Moderna and J&J vaccines to the recommended groups, in addition to the previously approved Pfizer vaccine booster, at the Dulles Town Center clinic by appointment only.

Anyone who received the J&J vaccine can receive a booster dose of any of the three vaccine types at least two months following their initial vaccination. Anyone who received their initial two-dose series of Moderna or Pfizer vaccine at least six months (180 days) ago is eligible for a booster dose of any of the three types of vaccine if they are in any the groups approved by the CDC and authorized by VDH, which are:

- People 65 years and older.
- Residents of long-term care facilities.
- People 18-64 years old with underlying medical conditions.
- People 18-64 years old who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional settings, such as, but not limited to, health care workers and caregivers for frail or immunocompromised people

You can find the date of your second dose on your vaccination card. If you received your second dose in Virginia and have misplaced the card, you can find the date of your second dose by searching for your vaccine record [online](#). If you need assistance over the phone, call 877-VAX-IN-VA (877-829-4682). Assistance is available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Residents seeking a vaccine booster are not required to offer any proof of risk.

All residents who need the initial series of COVID19 vaccine or a booster may receive one from many providers in the community, such as medical offices and pharmacies including, but not limited to, CVS, Giant Food, Harris Teeter, Safeway, Walgreens, Walmart and Wegmans. These locations have the benefit of being able to also provide the flu vaccine at the same time. Visit vaccines.gov to find a vaccination site near you.

To make an appointment for a COVID-19 vaccine at the County's Dulles Town Center site, visit loudoun.gov/covid19vaccine. The flu vaccine is not available at the Dulles Town Center clinic.

The Virginia Department of Health has added a [scannable QR code](#) to vaccination records. The technology allows anyone vaccinated in Virginia to show proof of vaccination with a digital or printed QR code instead of a paper card. If you have moved to Loudoun from another state since receiving your second dose, you should check with the health department from your previous jurisdiction for your vaccination record.

Loudoun County encourages everyone to stay informed about COVID-19 and the upcoming vaccination recommendations.
