Hello, Loudoun

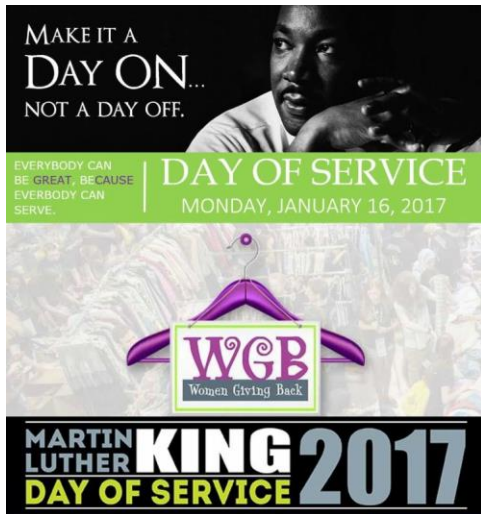
