Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services Creates Virtual Programs

The Loudoun County Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services (PRCS) is open virtually while its centers are closed and programs canceled in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Board of Supervisors Approve \$1 Million Small Business Relief Fund

The Board of Supervisors approved a \$1 million fund to provide emergency aid to Loudoun small businesses hurt by the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as a \$150,000 fund specifically for rural businesses with two or fewer employees.

The Business Interruption Fund will provide businesses grants of up to \$10,000 to address day-to-day expenses like utilities, insurance, payroll, and rent. That money will come out of a fund normally used for attracting new businesses. To make the application process as fair as possible, the Department of Economic Development will open applications for a 72-hour window, opening at noon on April 29 and closing at noon on May 1, and later choose at random from all qualifying businesses.

To be eligible, businesses must have between three and 100 employees, demonstrate a revenue loss of at least 25 percent directly related to COVID-19, and less than \$2.5 million in annual gross receipts. Grants are capped at \$7,500 for businesses with up to 50 employees and at \$10,000 for businesses with up to 100 employees.
