Upon arrival deputies located a victim suffering from multiple stab wounds. The victim and witnesses reported that while they were driving in the area, they noticed a male riding a bicycle, whom acquaintances had had an interaction with earlier. The driver and one of the passengers exited the vehicle to confront the male on the bike. The male on the bike then stabbed and assaulted one of the males who had exited the vehicle. The victim was taken to a local area hospital for treatment of his non-life-threatening injuries. The suspect is described as a Hispanic male, approximately 20 years old, no facial hair, wearing a black t-shirt, black short/pants, black bucket style hat, and riding a black BMX style bicycle. INTERNET SAFETY

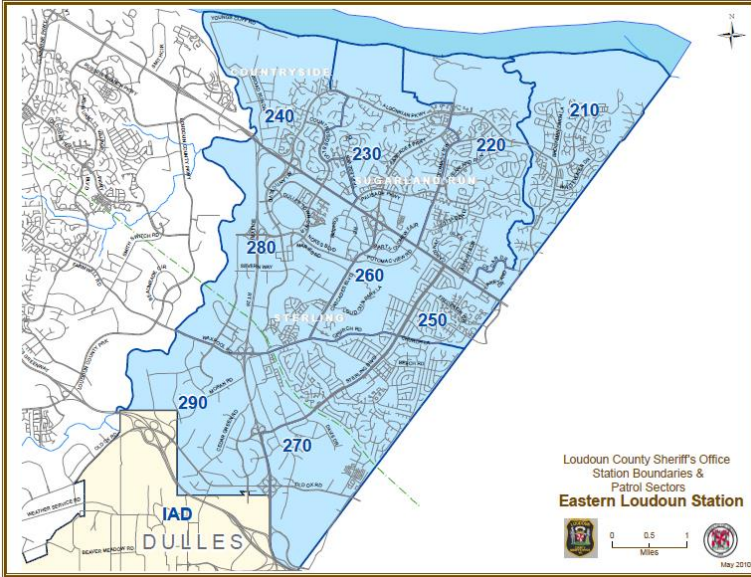
The internet is a wonderful resource for kids, they can use it to conduct research for school reports, communicate with friends and play games. Online access also comes with risks. The safety tips below will help you start an open dialogue on how to use the internet safely.

- Discuss the benefits and risks of the internet with you Child. Ask what they do online, what websites they visit, whom they chat with, what social media accounts they have, what games they play, etc.
- Remind them to never give anyone their password, name, address, the name of the school or any information about your family.
- Keep the computer in a public room in the house.
- Monitor your child's internet usage outside the home.
- Talk to your child about the danger of internet predators and what to do if they are contacted by someone whom they do not know.
- Use parental controls and or blocking/ filtering software.
- Review your child's computer and emails on a regular basis.

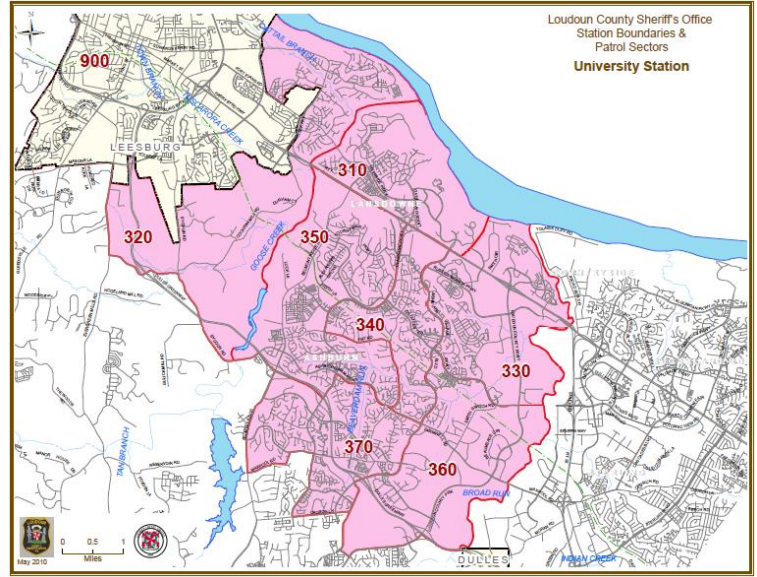

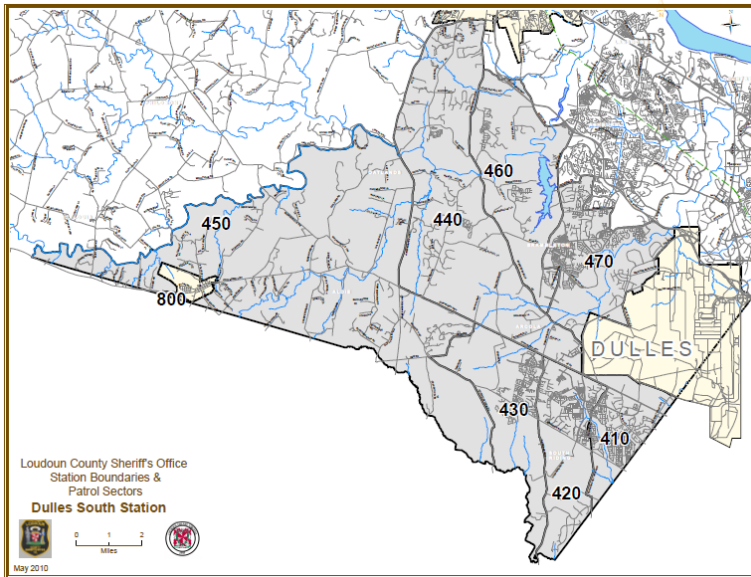
Eastern Loudoun Station: SECTOR 2
