Program Descriptions

Intro to Loudoun County Animal Services

Length of time: 30min- 1 hour

This basic program is the advised starting program for CASA and scout groups. The program introduces students to the Loudoun County Animal Services, who we are, what animals we serve and how we help. It highlights the work of our shelter staff and animal control, discussing the animals we work with and why they need our help. The program touches on both the domestic and wild animals of Loudoun County that LCAS interacts with. It wraps up with discussion of animal safety and what students can do if they see a pet or wild animal in need.

Careers with Animals

Length of time: 45min

This program looks into the myriad ways students can create a career working with animals from veterinary assistant to shelter director. It explores the requirements of popular animal careers such as veterinarian and behaviorist. The program provides insight into careers in animal health, training, sheltering, welfare, advocacy and more.

Shelter Tour

Length of time: 1 hour

At Loudoun County Animal Services

This is the ideal program for groups looking to visit the shelter whether as a scout group, educational tour or birthday party. The tour fee is \$10 per student. Depending on student ages, adults may be required to attend (without additional fee). Typically for younger students this is 1 adult to every 3 children. The tour begins with a brief introduction in the shelter's lobby. This is followed by an overview of the shelter and educational activity in our behavior building, culminating in a tour of the shelter as a whole. Tour leaders work to ensure that students get to pet at least one animal during .

Wildlife Program

Length of time: 45min

This program focuses on the wildlife which can be found within Loudoun County and how those animals interact with humans. It goes over habitat and behaviors of these animals as well as safety precautions that can be taken. Finally the program addresses how and why animal services responds to wildlife situations.
